ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2025

On a bright Friday morning, the Dishari Janakallan Foundation held its Annual General Meeting (AGM), bringing together its general members, donors, and community representatives to reflect on a year of meaningful service and plan for an even impactful future.

The atmosphere was one of warmth and purpose as attendees gathered over breakfast, eager to hear about the foundation's progress and share their visions for what lies ahead.

A MORNING OF REFLECTION AND RECOGNITION

The first session, led by Vice Chairman Mr. Hassan Reza Khan and Executive Director Mr. Masudur Rahman, highlighted the foundation's key achievements over the past year. Central to the discussion was the success of Project Shohay, a micro-credit initiative designed to support those often left behind by traditional financial systems.

Through Shohay, the foundation has provided interest-free or low-interest microloans to over 500 street vendors and underprivileged women across Rajshahi. Many of these beneficiaries had been repeatedly turned away from conventional micro-credit institutions due to their extreme poverty or lack of collateral.

"We didn't just give loans - we gave trust," said Executive Director Masudur Rahman. "These are people with dreams, resilience, and determination. All they needed was a chance."

A LEGACY OF SERVICE, A FUTURE OF HOPE

The founders of Dishari—originally just four friends with a vision—were especially remembered during the proceedings. Although they are no longer directly involved, their spirit of service lives on through a new generation of leaders committed to the same mission.

Current Chairman Mr. Md. Abdul Aziz emotionally recounted the organization's humble beginnings and praised the dedication of both longtime and new members.

"We are not owners of this foundation—we are its caretakers. Our duty is to nurture it and hand it over to the next capable hands, so the light of service never dims."

AFTERNOON SESSION: ENVISIONING TOMORROW

After a shared lunch, the second session opened the floor for suggestions and future planning. Members proposed several new initiatives, including:

Education Support Programs for children from low-income families
 Maternity & Childcare Centers in rural villages
 Nanny & Caregiver Training aligned with urban household needs
 Vocational Training in tailoring, embroidery, and mobile repairing

These proposals were warmly received and will be developed into formal project proposals in the coming months.

CLOSING WITH COMMITMENT

The AGM concluded with an inspiring address from Chairman Mr. Md. Abdul Aziz, who reaffirmed the foundation's commitment to providing sustainable and compassionate service.

"We measure our success not in numbers, but in changed lives. Every vendor who earns with dignity, every woman who builds her small business—that is our real annual report."
